Dear Mr. Chester,

Thank you for taking the time to comment – we will consider your comments as we continue our review and we will ensure that the applicant (Crown Castle) also receives a copy of your comments.

To your two questions:

- The City cannot require undergrounding of power (i.e. by rule of law) though we have been successful in the past in encouraging or insisting that power be undergrounded. I have flagged this particular item as a requirement for the city to require as we look at establishing permanent small cell standards.
- Once the City has issued a decision on the small cell land use application, an appeal may be filed.
  - o Consistent with our standard practice, we will notify you once a decision has been issued.
  - o An appeal must be filed within 14 days of the date of the decision.
  - o To file the appeal, you will need to complete the appeal form (here: <a href="http://www.mercergov.org/files/AppealForm.pdf">http://www.mercergov.org/files/AppealForm.pdf</a>) and pay the appeal fee of \$990.86.
  - Once the appeal has been filed, the City will file the appeal with the Hearing Examiner and seek to schedule the public hearing on the appeal.

- pointing me towards the appeals process

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

Hi Mr. Maxim-

Once again, thank you so much for the time you spent with me on Monday night. I can only imagine the range of resident issues that you deal with and the challenge of budgeting time.

As promised, attached is the document that we (partially) presented and distributed to the City Council. I have followed up this morning by email with each of the Council members to make sure they have a copy.

In the meantime:

- You mentioned that you were looking further into the authority and commitment the City would have to require power wires be buried in the case that the permit were approved. I look forward to learning more about that.
- You said that we would be informed when the status of the permit is determined (denied or approved) and that given workload and timing issues it is likely that this would be close to the deadline in August. I do appreciate your keeping us informed.
- You mentioned that there is an appeals process for permit decisions. Could you please refer me to the rule or explanation of how that works? I searched but could not find it.
