1. Construct a silt fence/boom waterward of the bulkhead to contain any silt and debris that may be generated during construction.
2. Install new Doug-Fir pile caps and attach to the piles with a steel plate and thru-bolts.
3. Install new Doug-Fir stringers on to the pile caps to support the ThruFlow grating.
4. Install new trim along edges of deck, flush with ThruFlow decking.
5. Install electrical conduit and water lines under the deck along the dock. Wiring and re-connection to be completed by others.
6. Install the ThruFlow grating with stainless steel screws making sure the screws are aligned and flush with the surface.
7. Install cedar fascia along side of dock to bottom of cap.
8. Install any boat or PWC lifts.
9. Clean the work area and remove the silt fence/boom.

All dock and pile work will be performed from a barge. The barge will contain a perimeter containment sock to keep silt and debris from re-entering the lake. The deck consists of a light penetrating surface. We propose to implement a shoreline planting plan to mitigate for the dock.


