The property is a developed lot, with the shoreline being predominately vegetated by grasses.

There is a single-family residence on the property with 5 bedrooms and 3 bathrooms. The square footage of the residence as recorded by King County as 1,590 ft² for the first floor, 1,430 ft² for the second floor, and 1,590 ft² for the finished basement, totaling 4,610 ft². The home is recorded as being in very good condition, and has a year built of 2018. The only other structure on the property is the dilapidated dock system this project is proposing a replacement for.

The existing dilapidated dock structure will be disassembled by use of hand tools, with sections being loaded onto a work barge to be removed from the work site. Sections of existing dock will be loaded onto a trailer and disposed of at an appropriate waste management facility. The replacement dock system will be constructed off site, and brought to the worksite by floating it into place. As much construction as can be done off site will be performed to minimize time spent working in the waterway. Sections will be floated into place and assembled. Dock system will be pile supported, sixteen 8" pile will be driven by vibratory hammer to secure the dock system in the waterway. All proposed work will occur within the 100-year floodplain.

Deconstruction of the old dock system and the installation of the new dock system will be performed with hand tools. Pile will be driven by vibratory hammer to reduce impacts to the waterway.

The proposed work is the removal of an old dilapidated dock system. The old dock is detrimental to the waterway and represents a larger area of impenetrable overwater structure. The replacement dock will have a smaller overwater coverage and will be light penetrable, improving the quality of the under water environment. As such we feel no mitigation should be required for the proposed work.
